



The New North Richmond Farm: Hub for Empowerment & Liberation

# **Meet Princess**

When I was 24, working odd jobs and sleeping in my family's living room, I was trying to survive and sending out my resume to everyone and anyone. Then Urban Tilth gave me the opportunity to co-manage a three-year apprenticeship on Wildcat Creek Trail in North Richmond.

Soon I was getting paid to take care of my neighborhood, learn about our Watershed, and revitalizing the environment. At the Farm Groundbreaking, I planted one of the very first seeds but only later realized Urban Tilth had planted seeds inside of me too- my mind grew, my heart grew, and my life grew.

Now, I help residents open cooperative businesses that create assets and ownership for my people. Because of Urban Tilth, I know exactly who I am and where I'm going.





Urban Tilth inspires, hires, and trains local residents to cultivate agriculture, feed our community, and restore relationships to land to build a more sustainable food system, within a just and healthier community.

For more than 16 years, Urban Tilth has transformed a once blighted vacant lot into a flourishing community hub that provides jobs, food, power building and community healing.





Our current interim farm is already a magnet for hundreds who join us to steward the land, tend the soil, plant, harvest, and enjoy the food. In 2020 alone we:

- Provided jobs to 49 local residents
- Distributed 62,677 lbs of fresh, healthy food
- Delivered 11,429 CSA boxes to local families
- Engaged 2,289 community members as participants and volunteers

But the pandemic and unprecedented need in our community stretched our temporary infrastructure to its limits. We currently have a long waitlist for our CSA program, lack the space for cooking classes and kitchen production, and aren't able to grow everything we need on our land ourselves.

Our Farm needs to grow to meet the moment and prepare for the future.

### **More than a Farm**

Our vision is for the farm to serve as the heart of resident-led organizing in North Richmond, seeding healing, connection, self-determination, and opportunity for our entire community.



"While it is unquestionably an urban farm with a constellation of gardens that they tend, it is also an educational center, a place to organize, a hub for social and racial justice, a place to congregate, rejuvenate and heal. Situated in unincorporated North Richmond, they are vulnerable to much —from the shadow of Chevron to challenging zoning patterns to an absence of healthy food choices. Urban Tilth saw a need and rose to meet it—that's their way."


# **Building the Farm in Phases**

- Soil & Compost Shed

- Row Crops
- Orchard

- Upper Portion of History Walk

- Main Pedestrian Entry
- · Lower Portion of History Walk
- Ohlone Reflection Garden
- Native Plantings

The North Richmond Farm is a three-acre parcel of land, located at the corner of Fred Jackson Way and Brookside Dr., 5 blocks from the center of the community. The total cost of building the permanent farm is \$23 million which we've broken down into five phases. Our plan is to break ground towards the end of 2021 and build the farm through 2025.

#### Phase 1:

Make the farm accessible for people without cars

Bring all necessary utilities to the farm

Create safe, accessible green space available to neighbors 24/7

Install a permanent greenhouse

Double our growing capacity

Double our distribution capacity to provide residents fresh, healthy food

Open a multipurpose room for community organizing and events

# Phase 4: Cafe, Commercial Kitchen, and Cultural Spaces





Create the amphitheater as a community-owned cultural and educational venue

Open a Cooperative Café run by residents

Build a community commercial kitchen to support local food entrepreneurs

Launch a program to teach youth to start and run small businesses

## Phase 5: Ohlone Reflection Garden, History Walk, and Urban Tilth Office





Immerse residents in the rich history of Richmond through the History Walk

Celebrate our community's indigenous roots through the Ohlone Reflection Garden

Build a native plant garden

# **Current Campaign Goal & Milestones**

#### Ensure we break ground in 2021!

With your donation before September 21st you will enable us to confidently begin construction this year.

Our current fundraising priorities are:

- \$350K to install Water
   Infrastructure! Help us water the seeds so they can grow.
- \$100K to install the 1st permitted Compost Toilet in Contra Costa County!
- Underwrite the new Bike Path and Sidewalks for \$200K. Many in our neighborhood don't own cars. Currently there is no safe way for residents to bicycle or walk to our location but you can change that by investing in an updated and accessible Fred Jackson Way.
