Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 3935) to amend title 49, United States Code, to reauthorize and improve the Federal Aviation Administration and other civil aviation programs, and for other purposes, and providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 3941) to prohibit the use of the facilities of a public elementary school, a public secondary school, or an institution of higher education to provide shelter for aliens who have not been admitted into the United States, and for other purposes.

Mrs. HOUCHIN, from the Committee on Rules, reported the following resolution; which was referred to the House Calendar and ordered to be printed

RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 3935) to amend title 49, United States Code, to reauthorize and improve the Federal Aviation Administration and other civil aviation programs, and for other purposes, and providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 3941) to prohibit the use of the facilities of a public elementary school, a public secondary school, or an institution of higher education to provide shelter for aliens who have not been admitted into the United States, and for other purposes.

1 *Resolved*, That at any time after adoption of this reso-2 lution the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 2(b) of rule 3 XVIII, declare the House resolved into the Committee of the Whole House on the state of the Union for consider-4 5 ation of the bill (H.R. 3935) to amend title 49, United States Code, to reauthorize and improve the Federal Avia-6 7 tion Administration and other civil aviation programs, and 8 for other purposes. The first reading of the bill shall be 9 dispensed with. All points of order against consideration 10 of the bill are waived. General debate shall be confined 11 to the bill and amendments specified in this section and shall not exceed one hour equally divided and controlled 12 13 by the chair and ranking minority member of the Com-14 mittee on Transportation and Infrastructure or their respective designees. After general debate the bill shall be 15 16 considered for amendment under the five-minute rule. In lieu of the amendment in the nature of a substitute rec-17 18 ommended by the Committee on Transportation and In-19 frastructure now printed in the bill, an amendment in the 20nature of a substitute consisting of the text of Rules Committee Print 118-11 shall be considered as adopted in the 21 22 House and in the Committee of the Whole. The bill, as 23 amended, shall be considered as the original bill for the purpose of further amendment under the five-minute rule 24

and shall be considered as read. All points of order against
 provisions in the bill, as amended, are waived.

3 SEC. 2. (a) No further amendment to the bill, as 4 amended, shall be in order except those printed in part 5 A of the report of the Committee on Rules accompanying 6 this resolution and amendments en bloc described in sec-7 tion 3 of this resolution.

8 (b) Each further amendment printed in part A of the 9 report of the Committee on Rules shall be considered only 10 in the order printed in the report, may be offered only by a Member designated in the report, shall be considered 11 12 as read, shall be debatable for the time specified in the 13 report equally divided and controlled by the proponent and an opponent, shall not be subject to amendment, and shall 14 15 not be subject to a demand for division of the question in the House or in the Committee of the Whole. 16

(c) All points of order against the further amendments printed in part A of the report of the Committee
on Rules or amendments en bloc described in section 3
of this resolution are waived.

SEC. 3. It shall be in order at any time for the chair of the Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure or his designee to offer amendments en bloc consisting of amendments printed in part A of the report of the Committee on Rules accompanying this resolution not earlier 4

disposed of. Amendments en bloc offered pursuant to this 1 2 section shall be considered as read, shall be debatable for 3 30 minutes equally divided and controlled by the chair and 4 ranking minority member of the Committee on Transpor-5 tation and Infrastructure or their respective designees, shall not be subject to amendment, and shall not be sub-6 ject to a demand for division of the question in the House 7 8 or in the Committee of the Whole.

9 SEC. 4. At the conclusion of consideration of the bill 10 for amendment the Committee shall rise and report the bill, as amended, to the House with such further amend-11 12 ments as may have been adopted. The previous question 13 shall be considered as ordered on the bill, as amended, and on any further amendment thereto to final passage 14 15 without intervening motion except one motion to recommit. 16

17 SEC. 5. Upon adoption of this resolution it shall be 18 in order to consider in the House the bill (H.R. 3941) to prohibit the use of the facilities of a public elementary 19 school, a public secondary school, or an institution of high-20 21 er education to provide shelter for aliens who have not 22 been admitted into the United States, and for other pur-23 poses. All points of order against consideration of the bill 24 are waived. The amendment in the nature of a substitute recommended by the Committee on Education and the 25

1 Workforce now printed in the bill shall be considered as 2 adopted. The bill, as amended, shall be considered as read. 3 All points of order against provisions in the bill, as amend-4 ed, are waived. The previous question shall be considered 5 as ordered on the bill, as amended, and on any further 6 amendment thereto, to final passage without intervening 7 motion except: (1) one hour of debate equally divided and 8 controlled by the chair and ranking minority member of 9 the Committee on Education and the Workforce or their respective designees; (2) the further amendment printed 10 in part B of the report of the Committee on Rules accom-11 12 panying this resolution, if offered by the Member designated in the report, which shall be in order without 13 intervention of any point of order, shall be considered as 14 15 read, shall be separately debatable for the time specified in the report equally divided and controlled by the pro-16 ponent and an opponent, and shall not be subject to a 17 demand for division of the question; and (3) one motion 18 19 to recommit.
