

## MOTION TO RECOMMIT WITH INSTRUCTIONS

M\_\_\_\_. \_\_\_\_\_ moves to recommit the bill, H.R. 754, to the Permanent Select Committee on Intelligence with instructions to report the same back to the House forthwith with the following amendment:

At the end of title III, add the following new section:

1   **SEC. 304. PRIORITIZATION OF FUNDING TO COMBAT TER-**  
2                                   **RORISTS.**

3           (a) FINDINGS.—Congress finds the following:

4                   (1) Under the leadership and direction of Presi-  
5           dent Barack Obama, the intelligence community per-  
6           formed with exceptional bravery, commitment, and  
7           professionalism in the pursuit of Osama bin Laden,  
8           who was killed on May 1, 2011, by the Naval Spe-  
9           cial Warfare Development Group.

10                   (2) The tremendous dedication and personal  
11           sacrifice of the anonymous men and women of the  
12           intelligence community over the course of nearly two  
13           decades, including under the leadership of former  
14           Presidents George W. Bush and Bill Clinton, finally  
15           brought a measure of justice and relief to the fami-  
16           lies and friends of those who lost their lives on Sep-

1       tember 11, 2001, and those killed around the world  
2       in al Qaeda-sponsored attacks.

3           (3) Director of the Central Intelligence Agency  
4       Leon Panetta, the Naval Special Warfare Develop-  
5       ment Group, and all those involved in the intel-  
6       ligence operation against bin Laden and in ongoing  
7       intelligence-related counterterrorism operations are  
8       to be commended for their vigilance in protecting the  
9       United States.

10          (4) The death of bin Laden marks the most sig-  
11       nificant achievement to date in the efforts of the in-  
12       telligence community to defeat al Qaeda, but the al  
13       Qaeda network and its affiliates still pose a critical  
14       threat to the national security of the United States  
15       and must be pursued.

16       (b) PRIORITIZATION OF FUNDING.—In obligating  
17   and expending funds authorized to be appropriated in this  
18   Act, the head of each element of the intelligence commu-  
19   nity shall place the highest priority on funding activities  
20   that will contribute to the continued disruption, dismantle-  
21   ment, and defeat of remaining al Qaeda terrorists and af-  
22   filiated organizations that threaten the national security  
23   of the United States.
