1SEC. 2. PARTICIPATION OF ABSENT MEMBERS IN COM-2MITTEE HEARINGS THROUGH VIDEO CON-3FERENCING AND RELATED TECHNOLOGIES.

4 (a) ENABLING PARTICIPATION OF ABSENT MEM5 BERS.—Rule XI of the Rules of the House of Representa6 tives is amended by adding at the end the following new
7 clause:

8 "Participation of absent members

9 "7. Each committee shall permit any member of the 10 committee who is absent from the site of a hearing convened by the committee, as well as any other individual 11 12 who is invited to participate in the hearing and who is 13 absent from the site of the hearing, to use video confer-14 encing and related technologies in order to participate in 15 the hearing to the same extent as members of the committee and other individuals (as the case may be) who are 16 17 present at the site of the meeting.".

18 (b) INCLUSION OF MEMBERS PARTICIPATING RE-19 MOTELY IN DETERMINATION OF QUORUM.—Subpara-20 graphs (2) and (3) of clause 2(h) of rule XI of the Rules 21 of the House of Representatives are each amended by add-22 ing at the end the following sentence: "A committee shall 23 adopt a rule under which a member who participates in 24 a hearing remotely pursuant to clause 7 shall be included 25 in determining the number of members constituting a quorum at the hearing for purposes of this subpara graph.".

3 SEC. 3. PERMITTING ABSENT MEMBERS TO VOTE RE-4 MOTELY ON SUSPENSION MOTIONS.

5 Clause 1 of rule XV of the Rules of the House of
6 Representatives is amended by adding at the end the fol7 lowing new paragraph:

8 "(d) The Clerk, Chief Administrative Officer, and 9 Sergeant at Arms shall work together to develop and im-10 plement a secure remote voting system under which any 11 member who is absent from the floor shall be permitted 12 to cast a vote remotely on a motion to suspend the rules 13 under this clause if the vote is taken by electronic device. 14 A member who casts such a vote using the remote voting 15 system under this subparagraph shall be treated as 16 present for purposes of determining the existence of a 17 quorum for considering the motion.".
