RESOLUTION

- Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 2289) to reauthorize the Commodity Futures Trading Commission, to better protect futures customers, to provide end-users with market certainty, to make basic reforms to ensure transparency and accountability at the Commission, to help farmers, ranchers, and end-users manage risks, to help keep consumer costs low, and for other purposes.
 - *Resolved*, That at any time after adoption of this reso lution the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 2(b) of rule

XVIII, declare the House resolved into the Committee of 1 2 the Whole House on the state of the Union for consider-3 ation of the bill (H.R. 2289) to reauthorize the Com-4 modity Futures Trading Commission, to better protect fu-5 tures customers, to provide end-users with market certainty, to make basic reforms to ensure transparency and 6 7 accountability at the Commission, to help farmers, ranch-8 ers, and end-users manage risks, to help keep consumer 9 costs low, and for other purposes. The first reading of the 10 bill shall be dispensed with. All points of order against consideration of the bill are waived. General debate shall 11 be confined to the bill and amendments specified in this 12 13 section and shall not exceed one hour equally divided and controlled by the chair and ranking minority member of 14 15 the Committee on Agriculture. After general debate the bill shall be considered for amendment under the five-16 minute rule. In lieu of the amendment in the nature of 17 18 a substitute recommended by the Committee on Agriculture now printed in the bill, it shall be in order to con-19 20sider as an original bill for the purpose of amendment 21 under the five-minute rule an amendment in the nature 22 of a substitute consisting of the text of Rules Committee 23 Print 114-18. That amendment in the nature of a sub-24 stitute shall be considered as read. All points of order 25 against that amendment in the nature of a substitute are

waived. No amendment to that amendment in the nature 1 of a substitute shall be in order except those printed in 2 3 the report of the Committee on Rules accompanying this 4 resolution. Each such amendment may be offered only in 5 the order printed in the report, may be offered only by a Member designated in the report, shall be considered 6 7 as read, shall be debatable for the time specified in the 8 report equally divided and controlled by the proponent and 9 an opponent, shall not be subject to amendment, and shall 10 not be subject to a demand for division of the question in the House or in the Committee of the Whole. All points 11 12 of order against such amendments are waived. At the conclusion of consideration of the bill for amendment the 13 Committee shall rise and report the bill to the House with 14 15 such amendments as may have been adopted. Any Member may demand a separate vote in the House on any amend-16 ment adopted in the Committee of the Whole to the bill 17 or to the amendment in the nature of a substitute made 18 in order as original text. The previous question shall be 19 considered as ordered on the bill and amendments thereto 20 21 to final passage without intervening motion except one 22 motion to recommit with or without instructions.
