Mr. NEWHOUSE, from the Committee on Rules, reported the following resolution; which was referred to the House Calendar and ordered to be printed

RESOLUTION

- Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 2898) to provide drought relief in the State of California, and for other purposes, and providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 3038) to provide an extension of Federal-aid highway, highway safety, motor carrier safety, transit, and other programs funded out of the Highway Trust Fund, and for other purposes.

 - 2 lution the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 2(b) of rule

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XVIII, declare the House resolved into the Committee of 1 the Whole House on the state of the Union for consider-2 3 ation of the bill (H.R. 2898) to provide drought relief in 4 the State of California, and for other purposes. The first 5 reading of the bill shall be dispensed with. All points of order against consideration of the bill are waived. General 6 7 debate shall be confined to the bill and shall not exceed 8 one hour equally divided and controlled by the chair and 9 ranking minority member of the Committee on Natural 10 Resources. After general debate the bill shall be considered for amendment under the five-minute rule. In lieu of the 11 12 amendment in the nature of a substitute recommended by 13 the Committee on Natural Resources now printed in the bill, it shall be in order to consider as an original bill for 14 15 the purpose of amendment under the five-minute rule an amendment in the nature of a substitute consisting of the 16 text of Rules Committee Print 114-23. That amendment 17 in the nature of a substitute shall be considered as read. 18 19 All points of order against that amendment in the nature of a substitute are waived. No amendment to that amend-20 21 ment in the nature of a substitute shall be in order except 22 those printed in the report of the Committee on Rules ac-23 companying this resolution. Each such amendment may 24 be offered only in the order printed in the report, may be offered only by a Member designated in the report, 25

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shall be considered as read, shall be debatable for the time 1 2 specified in the report equally divided and controlled by 3 the proponent and an opponent, shall not be subject to amendment, and shall not be subject to a demand for divi-4 5 sion of the question in the House or in the Committee of the Whole. All points of order against such amendments 6 7 are waived. At the conclusion of consideration of the bill 8 for amendment the Committee shall rise and report the 9 bill to the House with such amendments as may have been 10 adopted. Any Member may demand a separate vote in the House on any amendment adopted in the Committee of 11 12 the Whole to the bill or to the amendment in the nature 13 of a substitute made in order as original text. The previous question shall be considered as ordered on the bill and 14 15 amendments thereto to final passage without intervening motion except one motion to recommit with or without in-16 structions. 17

18 SEC. 2. Upon adoption of this resolution it shall be in order to consider in the House the bill (H.R. 3038) 19 to provide an extension of Federal-aid highway, highway 20 21 safety, motor carrier safety, transit, and other programs 22 funded out of the Highway Trust Fund, and for other pur-23 poses. All points of order against consideration of the bill 24 are waived. The bill shall be considered as read. All points 25 of order against provisions in the bill are waived. The previous question shall be considered as ordered on the bill
and on any amendment thereto to final passage without
intervening motion except: (1) one hour of debate equally
divided among and controlled by the chair and ranking
minority member of the Committee on Transportation and
Infrastructure and the chair and ranking minority member of the Committee on Ways and Means; and (2) one
motion to recommit.
