- Making emergency supplemental appropriations for coronavirus response and relief for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2022, and for other purposes.
 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
 - 3 That the following sums are appropriated, out of any
 - 4 money in the Treasury not otherwise appropriated, for the
 - 5 fiscal year ending September 30, 2022, and for other pur-
 - 6 poses, namely:

19	expenses of advanced research and development, manufac-
20	turing, production, and purchase, at the discretion of the
21	Secretary of Health and Human Services, of vaccines,
22	the rapeutics, diagnostics, and supplies necessary for the
23	administration of such vaccines, therapeutics, and
24	diagnostics: Provided further, That from the amount made
25	available in the preceding proviso, not less than

1 \$5,000,000,000 shall be available for necessary expenses 2 to research, develop, manufacture, produce, purchase, and administer therapeutics: *Provided further*, That from the 3 4 amount made available under this heading in this Act, not 5 less than \$750,000,000 shall be available for research and clinical trials related to research on, clinical trials for, and 6 7 development and procurement of, vaccines for emerging 8 coronavirus variants, and to support the sustainment and 9 expansion of vaccine manufacturing capacity, including fill-finish capacity: Provided further, That products, sup-10 plies, and equipment purchased with amounts provided 11 12 under this heading in this Act may, at the discretion of the Secretary of Health and Human Services, be deposited 13 in the Strategic National Stockpile under section 319F-14 15 2(a) of the Public Health Service Act: *Provided further*, 16 That amounts provided under this heading in this Act may be used for the construction, alteration, or renovation of 17 non-federally owned U.S.-based facilities for the produc-18 19 tion of vaccines, therapeutics, diagnostics, and ancillary 20medical supplies where the Secretary determines that such 21 a contract is necessary to secure sufficient amounts of 22 such supplies: Provided further, That amounts provided 23 under this heading in this Act may be transferred to, and 24 merged with, the fund authorized by section 319F–4, the 25 Covered Countermeasure Process Fund, of the Public

Health Service Act: *Provided further*, That the transfer 1 2 authority provided under this heading in this Act is in ad-3 dition to any other transfer authority provided by law: 4 *Provided further*, That the Secretary shall notify the Committees on Appropriations of the House of Representatives 5 and the Senate at least 2 days in advance of any obligation 6 7 in excess of \$50,000,000, including but not limited to con-8 tracts and interagency agreements, from amounts pro-9 vided under this heading in this Act: *Provided further*, 10 That the Secretary shall provide a report to the Committees on Appropriations of the House of Representatives 11 12 and the Senate not later than 30 days after the date of enactment of this Act, and every 30 days thereafter until 13 all amounts provided under this heading in this Act have 14 15 been expended, detailing obligations of such amounts in excess of \$20,000,000, with annotation of which Depart-16 ment or agency, and component thereof is managing the 17 contract; the current inventory of COVID-19 vaccines, 18 19 therapeutics, and diagnostics; and the distribution of 20 COVID–19 vaccines, therapeutics, and diagnostics during 21 the previous month, reported by State and other jurisdic-22 tion.

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GENERAL PROVISIONS—THIS TITLE (INCLUDING TRANSFER OF FUNDS)

3 SEC. 1101. Funds appropriated by this title under 4 the heading "Public Health and Social Services Emer-5 gency Fund" may be transferred to, and merged with, 6 other appropriation accounts under the heading "National 7 Institutes of Health" to prevent, prepare for, and respond 8 to coronavirus: *Provided*, That the Committees on Appro-9 priations of the House of Representatives and the Senate 10 shall be notified 10 days in advance of any such transfer: *Provided further*, That the transfer authority provided by 11 12 this section is in addition to any other transfer authority 13 provided by law: *Provided further*, That, upon a deter-14 mination that all or part of the funds transferred from 15 an appropriation by this Act are not necessary, such amounts may be transferred back to that appropriation: 16 *Provided further*, That none of the funds made available 17 by this Act may be transferred pursuant to the authority 18 in section 205 of the Departments of Labor, Health and 19 Human Services, and Education, and Related Agencies 2021 Appropriations Act, 2022 or section 241(a) of the Public 22 Health Service Act.

SEC. 1102. Not later than 30 days after the date of
enactment of this Act, the Secretary of Health and
Human Services shall provide a detailed spend plan of an-

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ticipated uses of funds made available in this title, includ-1 ing estimated personnel and administrative costs, to the 2 3 Committees on Appropriations of the House of Represent-4 atives and the Senate: *Provided*, That such plans shall be updated and submitted to such Committees every 60 days 5 until all funds are expended: *Provided further*, That the 6 7 spend plans shall be accompanied by a listing of each con-8 tract obligation incurred that exceeds \$5,000,000 which 9 has not previously been reported, including the amount of 10 each such obligation: *Provided further*, That the Committees on Appropriations of the House of Representatives 11 and the Senate shall be briefed on obligations quarterly 12 13 until all funds are expended.

14 SEC. 1103. Not later than 60 days after the date of 15 enactment of this Act, the Secretary of Health and Human Services shall provide biweekly obligation reports, 16 including anticipated use of funds made available in this 17 title, to the Committees on Appropriations of the House 18 19 of Representatives and the Senate: *Provided*, That such 20reports shall be updated and submitted biweekly to the 21 Committees until all funds are expended.

SEC. 1104. Not later than 30 days after the date of enactment of this Act, the Secretary of Health and Human Services shall provide monthly reports on obligations made with these supplemental funds related to: (1)

research; (2) advanced development; (3) procurement; or 1 2 (4) administration activities to the Committees on Appro-3 priations of the House of Representatives and the Senate 4 and the Committee on Energy and Commerce of the 5 House of Representatives and Committee on Health, Education, Labor, and Pensions of the Senate: Provided, That 6 7 such report shall include for procurement contracts: (1) 8 recipient; (2) total number of units purchased; (3) delivery 9 dates; (4) any options on such contracts; and (5) location of manufactured product: Provided further, That such re-10 11 port shall include projections of the supply of and domestic 12 need for vaccines, therapeutics, tests, and ancillary med-13 ical supplies over the next 90 days to prepare for and re-14 spond to coronavirus, to the extent such information is 15 available: *Provided further*, That such reports shall be updated and submitted monthly to the Committees until all 16 17 funds are expended. 18 TITLE II 19 DEPARTMENT OF STATE AND RELATED 20 AGENCY 21 DEPARTMENT OF STATE 22 Administration of Foreign Affairs 23 DIPLOMATIC PROGRAMS

sidered a contribution for the purpose of applying such
 section 202(d)(4)(A)(i).

16 SEC. 1201. The reporting requirement provided by 17 section 406(b) of the Coronavirus Preparedness and Re-18 sponse Supplemental Appropriations Act, 2020 (division 19 A of Public Law 116–123) shall apply to funds appro-20 priated by this title, except that such section 406(b) shall 21 be applied to such funds by substituting "September 30, 22 2023" for "September 30, 2022".

SEC. 1202. (a) Funds appropriated by this title under
the headings "Global Health Programs", "International
Disaster Assistance", and "Migration and Refugee Assist-

ance" may be transferred to, and merged with, funds ap propriated by this title under such headings to prevent,
 prepare for, and respond to coronavirus, and for humani tarian needs.

5 (b) The authorities and limitations provided by sec6 tions 402(d), 402(e), and 402(f) of the Coronavirus Pre7 paredness and Response Supplemental Appropriations
8 Act, 2020 (division A of Public Law 116–123) shall apply
9 to the funds appropriated and authorities provided by this
10 title.

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TITLE III

12 GENERAL PROVISIONS—THIS ACT

SEC. 1301. Each amount appropriated or made available by this Act is in addition to amounts otherwise appropriated for the fiscal year involved.

SEC. 1302. No part of any appropriation contained
in this Act shall remain available for obligation beyond
the current fiscal year unless expressly so provided herein.

SEC. 1303. Unless otherwise provided for by this Act,
the additional amounts appropriated by this Act to appropriations accounts shall be available under the authorities
and conditions applicable to such appropriations accounts
for fiscal year 2022.

24 SEC. 1304. Each amount provided by this Act is des-25 ignated by the Congress as being for an emergency requirement pursuant to section 4001(a)(1) and section
 4001(b) of S. Con. Res. 14 (117th Congress), the concur rent resolution on the budget for fiscal year 2022.

4 SEC. 1305. In this Act, the term "coronavirus"
5 means SARS-CoV-2 or another coronavirus with pan6 demic potential.

SEC. 1306. (a) Of the unobligated balances from
amounts made available to the Department of Agriculture
in section 1001(a) of subtitle A of title I of the American
Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (Public Law 117–2),
\$1,000,000,000 are hereby permanently rescinded.

12 (b) Of the unobligated balances from amounts made available under the heading "Small Business Administra-13 tion—Business Loans Program Account, CARES Act" in 14 15 section 323(d)(1)(A) of division N of the Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2021 (Public Law 116–260) for the cost 16 17 of guaranteed loans as authorized under paragraphs (36) and (37) of section 7(a) of the Small Business Act (15) 18 U.S.C. 636(a)), \$2,950,000,000 are hereby permanently 19 20 rescinded.

(c) Of the unexpended balances remaining from
amounts made available under the heading "Small Business Administration—Business Loans Program Account,
CARES Act" in section 1107(a)(1) of the Coronavirus
Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act (Public Law 116–

1 136), as amended by section 101(a)(2) of division A of
 2 the Paycheck Protection Program and Health Care En 3 hancement Act (Public Law 116–139), \$1,904,000,000
 4 shall be returned to the Treasury.

5 (d) Of the unobligated balances from amounts made 6 available to the Department of Education in section 2003 7 of title II of the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (Pub-8 lic Law 117–2) and allocated to institutions of higher edu-9 cation as defined in section 102(b) of the Higher Edu-10 cation Act of 1965, \$100,000,000 are hereby permanently 11 rescinded.

(e) Of the unobligated balances from amounts made
available to the Department of Transportation in section
7202(a) of title VII of the American Rescue Plan Act of
2021 (Public Law 117–2), \$2,000,000,000 are hereby
permanently rescinded.

17 (f) Of the unobligated balances from amounts made available to the Secretary of the Treasury (referred to in 18 this subsection as "Secretary") for administrative ex-19 20penses pursuant to section 4003(f) of the Coronavirus Aid, 21 Relief, and Economic Security Act (Public Law 116–136), 22 up to \$55,000,000 shall be available to the Secretary for 23 any administrative expenses of the Department of the 24 Treasury determined by the Secretary to be necessary to 25 implement section 501 of division N of the Consolidated

Appropriations Act, 2021 (Public Law 116–260), section
 3201 of the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (Public
 Law 117–2), or title VI of the Social Security Act (42
 U.S.C. 801 et seq.), in addition to amounts otherwise
 available for such purposes.

6 (g)(1) STATUTORY PAYGO SCORECARDS.—The
7 budgetary effects of this section shall not be entered on
8 either PAYGO scorecard maintained pursuant to section
9 4(d) of the Statutory Pay-As-You-Go Act of 2010.

(2) SENATE PAYGO SCORECARDS.—The budgetary
effects of this section shall not be entered on any PAYGO
scorecard maintained for purposes of section 4106 of H.
Con. Res. 71 (115th Congress).

14 (3) CLASSIFICATION OF BUDGETARY EFFECTS.—
15 Notwithstanding Rule 3 of the Budget Scorekeeping
16 Guidelines set forth in the joint explanatory statement of
17 the committee of conference accompanying Conference Re18 port 105–217 and section 250(c)(8) of the Balanced
19 Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985, the
20 budgetary effects of this section shall not be estimated—

(A) for purposes of section 251 of such Act;
(B) for purposes of an allocation to the Committee on Appropriations pursuant to section 302(a)
of the Congressional Budget Act of 1974; and

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(C) for purposes of paragraph (4)(C) of section
 3 of the Statutory Pay-As-You-Go Act of 2010 as
 being included in an appropriation Act.

4 SEC. 1307. Of the unobligated balances from amounts made available to the Department of Agriculture 5 under the heading "Agricultural Programs—Office of the 6 7 Secretary" in title I of division B of the Coronavirus Aid, 8 Relief, and Economic Security Act (Public Law 116–136), 9 \$650,000,000 are hereby permanently rescinded: Pro-10 vided, That the amounts rescinded pursuant to this sec-11 tion that were previously designated by the Congress as 12 emergency requirement an pursuant to section 251(b)(2)(A)(i) of the Balanced Budget and Emergency 13 Deficit Control Act of 1985 are designated by the Con-14 15 gress as an emergency requirement pursuant to section 16 4001(a)(1) and section 4001(b) of S. Con. Res. 14 (117th 17 Congress), the concurrent resolution on the budget for fis-18 cal year.
