RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 9640) to amend the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 to provide for examination and disclosure with respect to Presidential income tax returns; providing for consideration of the bill (S. 1942) to standardize the designation of National Heritage Areas, and for other purposes; and for other purposes.

All points of order 3 against consideration of the bill are waived. The bill shall 4 be considered as read. All points of order against provi-5 sions in the bill are waived. The previous question shall be considered as ordered on the bill and on any amend-6 7 ment thereto to final passage without intervening motion 8 except: (1) one hour of debate equally divided and con-9 trolled by the chair and ranking minority member of the 10 Committee on Ways and Means or their respective designees; and (2) one motion to recommit. 11

12 SEC. 2. Upon adoption of this resolution it shall be 13 in order to consider in the House the bill (S. 1942) to standardize the designation of National Heritage Areas, 14 15 and for other purposes. All points of order against consid-16 eration of the bill are waived. The bill shall be considered 17 as read. All points of order against provisions in the bill 18 are waived. The previous question shall be considered as 19 ordered on the bill and on any amendment thereto to final 20passage without intervening motion except: (1) one hour 21 of debate equally divided and controlled by the chair and 22 ranking minority member of the Committee on Natural 23 Resources or their respective designees; and (2) one mo-24 tion to commit.

25 SEC. 3. House Resolution 693 is hereby adopted.

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SEC. 4. House Resolution 1434 is hereby adopted.

SEC. 5. (a) At any time through the legislative day of Friday, December 23, 2022, the Speaker may entertain motions offered by the Majority Leader or a designee that the House suspend the rules as though under clause 1 of rule XV with respect to multiple measures described in subsection (b), and the Chair shall put the question on any such motion without debate or intervening motion.

9 (b) A measure referred to in subsection (a) includes 10 any measure that was the object of a motion to suspend 11 the rules on the legislative day of December 21, 2022, De-12 cember 22, 2022, or December 23, 2022, in the form as 13 so offered, on which the yeas and nays were ordered and 14 further proceedings postponed pursuant to clause 8 of rule 15 XX.

16 (c) Upon the offering of a motion pursuant to sub-17 section (a) concerning multiple measures, the ordering of 18 the yeas and nays on postponed motions to suspend the 19 rules with respect to such measures is vacated to the end 20 that all such motions are considered as withdrawn.

SEC. 6. On any legislative day of the second session
of the One Hundred Seventeenth Congress after December
22, 2022, the Journal of the proceedings of the previous
day shall be considered as approved.

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SEC. 7. The Speaker may appoint Members to per form the duties of the Chair for the duration of the period
 addressed by section 6 of this resolution as though under
 clause 8(a) of rule I.

5 SEC. 8. Each day during the period addressed by sec-6 tion 6 of this resolution shall not constitute a calendar 7 day for purposes of section 7 of the War Powers Resolu-8 tion (50 U.S.C. 1546).

9 SEC. 9. Each day during the period addressed by sec10 tion 6 of this resolution shall not constitute a legislative
11 day for purposes of clause 7 of rule XIII.

SEC. 10. Each day during the period addressed by
section 6 of this resolution shall not constitute a calendar
or legislative day for purposes of clause 7(c)(1) of rule
XXII.
