

Kā'eo Duarte is the Vice President of Community & 'Āina Resiliency at Kamehameha Schools, charged with stewardship of 360,000 acres of 'Āina Pauahi (KS land holdings) on five islands. He previously served as West Hawai'i Regional Director where he oversaw KS initiatives to unify and elevate people, programs, and land assets for greater community impact.

Prior to joining KS, he was a faculty member at the University of Hawaii at Mānoa where he specialized in indigenous resource management and hydrological sciences.

Duarte is currently Chair of the Board of Directors for Hawai'i Green Growth, and Chair of the Hawai'i Fresh Water Council.

He holds a Bachelor of Science in civil engineering from Princeton University and Doctorate in environmental engineering from the Massachusetts Institute of Technology.
