RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 8932) to establish an earlier application processing cycle for the FAFSA; providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 7409) to amend the Geothermal Steam Act of 1970 to waive the requirement for a Federal drilling permit for certain activities, to exempt certain activities from the requirements of the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969, and for other purposes; and providing for 2

1 *Resolved*, That upon adoption of this resolution it 2 shall be in order to consider in the House the bill (H.R. 3 8932) to establish an earlier application processing cycle 4 for the FAFSA. All points of order against consideration 5 of the bill are waived. The amendment in the nature of a substitute recommended by the Committee on Education 6 7 and the Workforce now printed in the bill shall be considered as adopted. The bill, as amended, shall be considered 8 9 as read. All points of order against provisions in the bill, 10 as amended, are waived. The previous question shall be considered as ordered on the bill, as amended, and on any 11 12 further amendment thereto to final passage without intervening motion except: (1) one hour of debate equally di-13 14 vided and controlled by the chair and ranking minority 15 member of the Committee on Education and the Workforce or their respective designees; and (2) one motion to 16 17 recommit.

18 SEC. 2. Upon adoption of this resolution it shall be 19 in order to consider in the House the bill (H.R. 7409) 20 to amend the Geothermal Steam Act of 1970 to waive the 21 requirement for a Federal drilling permit for certain ac-22 tivities, to exempt certain activities from the requirements 23 of the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969, and 3

for other purposes. All points of order against consider-1 2 ation of the bill are waived. The bill shall be considered 3 as read. All points of order against provisions in the bill 4 are waived. The previous question shall be considered as 5 ordered on the bill and on any amendment thereto to final passage without intervening motion except: (1) one hour 6 7 of debate equally divided and controlled by the chair and 8 ranking minority member of the Committee on Natural 9 Resources or their respective designees; and (2) one mo-10 tion to recommit.

11 SEC. 3. Upon adoption of this resolution it shall be 12 in order to consider in the House the bill (H.R. 8446) to amend the Energy Act of 2020 to include critical mate-13 rials in the definition of critical mineral, and for other pur-14 15 poses. All points of order against consideration of the bill are waived. The amendment in the nature of a substitute 16 recommended by the Committee on the Natural Resources 17 18 now printed in the bill shall be considered as adopted. The bill, as amended, shall be considered as read. All points 19 20 of order against provisions in the bill, as amended, are 21 waived. The previous question shall be considered as or-22 dered on the bill, as amended, and on any further amend-23 ment thereto to final passage without intervening motion 24 except: (1) one hour of debate equally divided and con-25 trolled by the chair and ranking minority member of the
