# RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 2240) to require the Attorney General to develop reports relating to violent attacks against law enforcement officers, and for other purposes; providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 2243) to amend title 18, United States Code, to improve the Law Enforcement Officer Safety Act and provisions relating to the carrying of concealed weapons by law enforcement officers, and for other purposes; and

providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 2255) to allow Federal law enforcement officers to purchase retired service weapons, and for other purposes.

1       *Resolved*, That upon adoption of this resolution it  
2 shall be in order to consider in the House any bill specified  
3 in section 2 of this resolution. All points of order against  
4 consideration of each such bill are waived. The respective  
5 amendments in the nature of a substitute recommended  
6 by the Committee on the Judiciary now printed in each  
7 such bill shall be considered as adopted. Each such bill,  
8 as amended, shall be considered as read. All points of  
9 order against provisions in each such bill, as amended, are  
10 waived. The previous question shall be considered as or-  
11 dered on each such bill, as amended, and on any further  
12 amendment thereto, to final passage without intervening  
13 motion except: (1) one hour of debate equally divided and  
14 controlled by the chair and ranking minority member of  
15 the Committee on the Judiciary or their respective des-  
16 ignees; and (2) one motion to recommit.

17       SEC. 2. The bills referred to in the first section of  
18 this resolution are as follows:

19               (a) The bill (H.R. 2240) to require the Attor-  
20 ney General to develop reports relating to violent at-  
21 tacks against law enforcement officers, and for other  
22 purposes.

1                   (b) The bill (H.R. 2243) to amend title 18,  
2                   United States Code, to improve the Law Enforce-  
3                   ment Officer Safety Act and provisions relating to  
4                   the carrying of concealed weapons by law enforce-  
5                   ment officers, and for other purposes.

6                   (c) The bill (H.R. 2255) to allow Federal law  
7                   enforcement officers to purchase retired service  
8                   weapons, and for other purposes.
